

GROUP CAPTAIN BRETT WILLIAMS, CSM


Officer Commanding Air Academy

He enlisted in the Royal New Zealand Air Force in 1996 as a Navigator where he served for 11 years prior to transferring to the Royal Australian Air Force as an Air Combat Officer.

Following navigator's course, Group Captain Williams spent the first portion of his career flying the P-3K Orion at RNZAF Base Whenuapai. Subsequent flying tours with New Zealand included time as an instructor at the School of Air Warfare where he was awarded an A Category Instructor rating.

On transfer to the Royal Australian Air Force, Group Captain Williams conducted further flying tours at both 10 and 11 Squadrons flying the AP-3C Orion prior to Commanding No. 92 Wing Detachment in
