
# Australia's Aviation Heritage

## **2024 Airshows Downunder**

Airshows Downunder, held on the weekend of 2 and 3 March, was by all accounts an enormous success.

The weather restricted some of the flying activities on Saturday, but Sunday the weather was fine and good for flying.

HARS had eight aircraft participating in flying exhibitions on both days. These were our Lockheed Super Constellation (Connie), Fokker Tri Engine replica "Southern Cross," Lockheed P2V-7 Neptune, Douglas Dakota and DC-3, De Havilland Caribou, Grumman Tracker, and Lockheed AP-3C Orion.

# Boeing 747-400 "City of Canberra" repaint.

Our Boeing 747 has now been at HARS for over nine years, having arrived in March 2015. Nine years of being subjected to the elements at Albion Park have taken their toll on the aircraft's paint work.

In late 2023, the huge project of giving the old girl a complete repaint commenced. About 50% of the aircraft has now been completed.

### **New Parkes Aviation Museum Site**

Work has continued on the new HARS Parkes museum site. The taxi way from our current site is complete along with leveling and smoothing of the parking area. The site is now as ready as possible for the RA Aus Fly in for Fun over the weekend of 12-14 April 2024.

### Dakota C-47 restoration.

Work has continued on the reassembly and restoration of the museum's C-47, with wings, horizonal stabiliser and fin now fitted. The aircraft is now largely complete.

## **HARS Southern Cross replica – help keep her flying!**

After the aircrafts post restoration first flight in December 2023, ongoing funding to keep her flying is needed. Importantly, the aircraft needs a spare engine so that it can confidently be displayed around the country. Being a fragile aircraft, it needs to be hangered when not in use. Should a breakdown occur way from base, exposure of the aircraft to the elements must be kept to a minimum, hence the requirement for a spare engine.

## **Did You Know**

- ... The prototype Junkers Ju 87 (Stuka dive bomber) was powered by a V12 Rolls-Royce Kestrel engine? The aircraft first flew on 17 September 1935.
- ... Rolls-Royce engines were used on several German aircraft during the mid-1930's? Another notable type being the Messerchmitt Bf 109 VI prototype which also used the V12 Rolls Royce Kestrel engine.
- ... The first General Dynamics F-111C for the RAAF was accepted at Fort Worth, Texas on 4 September 1968? However, due to technical issues the type does not enter service with the RAAF until mid-1973.

#### Wing Walk Experience

The Wing Walk will provide you with a unique perspective of the 747 taking you about sixteen meters (52 feet) along the right wing where your guide will explain many aspects of the aircraft components and operation. Wing Walk tours can be taken between 10am and 3pm for the price of \$75, which includes Museum entry.


#### The Total Boeing 747 Experience

This Premium Tour commences with a brief audio-visual presentation followed by a tour of the entire aircraft, including the cabin and galleys, crew rest areas, the avionics bay, forward cargo hold and a detailed inspection of the cockpit, conducted by experienced 747 crew. The tour duration is approximately 4 hours and includes a personalised tour of the full HARS Museum. The tour is priced at \$205 per person with a minimum of two and a maximum of four persons per tour.



#### 747 Cockpit Experience

The Cockpit Tour is conducted by an experienced 747 pilot who will explain the cockpit in detail and will take you through the many procedures required to mount a typical operation. Bookings are limited to two guests per tour, and costs \$110 per person which includes Museum entry.
